Equipment required:	Some example menus which ideally would include descriptions of the food.



Suggested procedure:	 Distribute example menus. Discuss with the children what type of food they would like if they were meeting up with a group of famous friends. Revise adjectives. Can the learners find examples of adjectives in the menus? Revise alliteration. Can the learners find examples of alliteration in the food titles or descriptions? As a whole class create a list of adjectives that can be used to describe foods, e.g. tasty, fresh, crunchy, spicy, exquisite,
	 succulent, tangy, etc. Learners to create their own menu, describing the foods using adjectives and alliteration.
Extension activities:	Learners could use a thesaurus to see if they can improve their descriptions. Learners to swap menus with a partner. What would they choose from their partners' menu and why?
